


Use the following steps to disable driver signature enforcement:

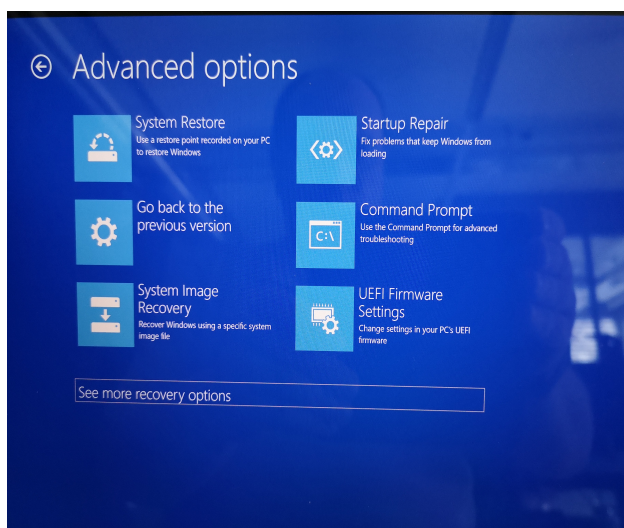
<b>Step 1</b>	Restart Windows	Press Shift + Restart Windows
<b>Step 2</b>		Click on “Troubleshoot”

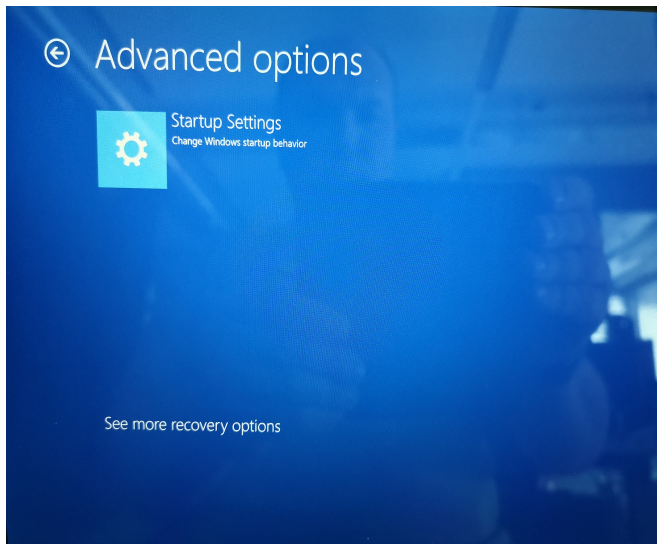
Click on “Advanced option”

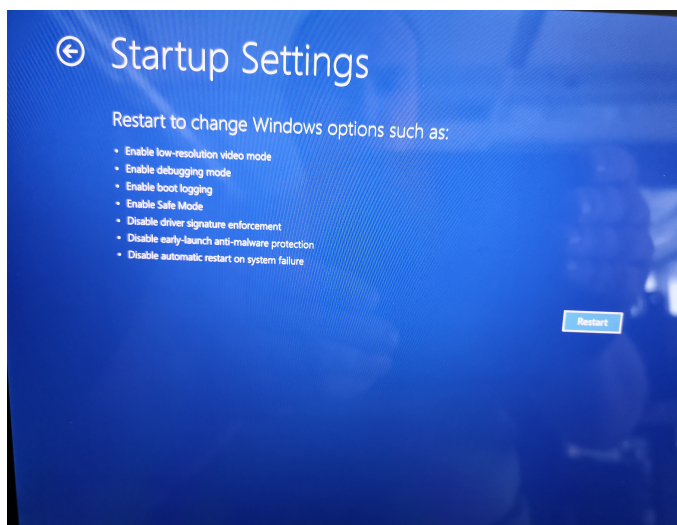
Click on “See more recovery options”




Click on “Startup Settings”
